
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#### **School Vision and Mission**

## **Teacher Professional Training and Development**



both at school and outside the school to enable them to be familiar with the latest educational trends, classroom strategies and teaching effectiveness. Each year, there exchanges and collaboration.



## Using English as the Medium of Instruction

o enhance students' English proficiency through increasing their exposure to authentic English outside the class, hence widening their horizons and strengthening their general knowledge, a number of English activities are regularly held, including Peer Reading Programme, Guided Reading Programme, English Week, Cross-curricular English Fun Day and Study Tours to Australia and New Zealand. Led by our NET teacher, the English ambassadors organize different activities to stimulate students' interest in learning English and enhance their confidence in using English.

There are 5 classes in S1, one of which is using English as the medium of instruction (EMI). English Language, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Life and Society are taught in English. Meanwhile, a number of subjects offered in the junior secondary curriculum are taught with extended learning activities (ELA) in English to increase opportunities for students to use English as a medium and motivate them to acquire English skills for further studies, leisure activities and work.


#### **Academic Achievement**

s a result of our teachers' and students' hard work, students performed satisfactorily in public examinations. Firstly, in the Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, 12 subjects' pass percentage was on par with the territory's average and some subjects reached positive value added scores of 7 to 9. A majority of subjects showed a rise in the pass percentage of 13% when compared with last year's data. Secondly, students' performance in the Territory System Assessment was encouraging. Almost all students reached the Basic Competency Level in Chinese, English and Mathematics with the passing percentage of the three subjects on par with the territory's average.

Since 2013, our school has had in total of 173 graduates pursuing a Bachelor's degree at local universities. In the academic year of 2017-2018, over 85% of S6 graduates were successfully enrolled in a Bachelor's degree

programme or an associate's degree / a Higher Diploma programme, mainly offered by the University of Hong Kong, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and Hong Kong Baptist University.

Our students' academic achievements have been recognized by the awards they received. Our graduates won a number of prominent awards, including the Harvest Scholarship Award, the Link First Generation University Student Scholarship and the Outstanding Student Award in the Kwun Tong Outstanding Students Election. It is worth noting that one graduate was selected by the International Youth Programme, which nominated only 11 students to represent Hong Kong to go overseas for a cultural exchange, to visit Ireland.

#### **Self-directed Learning**

#### Taking initiative for all stages of the learning process

We put emphasis on cultivating students' self-learning habits. It is believed that through teaching students notetaking skills, helping them set learning goals and asking them to keep reflective learning journals, students can be more organized, self-disciplined and responsible for their

learning. They are required to reflect on and evaluate their learning experience so as to gain a clearer view of their learning progress. Hence, their learning effectiveness will be enhanced.

#### Junior Secondary Remedial and Enhancement Classes

To cater for learner diversity, after-school remedial and enhancement classes in Chinese, English and Mathematics are run for junior secondary students with different learning

abilities. It is believed that students' confidence and learning motivation can be boosted.

#### Senior Secondary additional classes

We design an organised additional-class schedule for our senior secondary students. For secondary four and secondary five students, they need to attend additional classes after school from Tuesday to Thursday. Students

are divided into groups according to their abilities. To equip secondary six students with better exam skills, our school runs after-school classes and arrange students to take part in different mock exams organised outside school.


#### Strengthening summative assessment
